Programme Aim: To provide learners with the opportunity to develop the knowledge, skills, and competencies necessary to complete a range of plastering finishes to internal and external surfaces. Learners will explore the correct tools and materials used to fix dry lining slabs and plaster to surfaces, ensuring that all appropriate maintenance of tools and equipment are completed correctly. The learners will be able to differentiate between various plaster coats including bonding, floating, rough cast, plaster dots, and spots and stippling. Demonstrate the correct process of fixing dry lining slabs to walls and ceilings while ensuring the health, safety, and personal hygiene procedures are adhered to

Participants of this programme will:

- · Understand what health and safety legislation effects plastering
- Identify the correct PPE needed in order to complete a range of plastering tasks
- · Be capable of planning and designing an area ready to be plastered
- Complete a range of tasks to an excellent standard
- Be confident when providing advice and choosing the correct tools and equipment
- Be able to fix dry lining slabs to walls and ceilings, and apply a range of plaster coats to external and internal surfaces

Learners can follow direction and are moving towards independent learning, Learners will have the ability to read basic short text in a non-supported environment and will be able to make sense of quantitative information within a familiar setting or unfamiliar task in a familiar setting
QQI Assessment	Participants who wish to achieve a QQI component certificate must complete 100% Skills Demonstration
Resources Required in Order to Successfully Complete the Module	Some personal learning / study time will be required from participants. Programme packs, Assessment Briefs and some equipment will be provided as a part of the programme
Specific Entry/Access & Exemptions required	Access to programmes leading to level 3 is open. A learner seeking entry to a programme leading to awards at level 3 does not need a previous formal qualification. Some learners may have achieved certification at level 2. Recognition of Prior Learning may be considered to gain access without having certification entry requirements, to gain exception within a programme, attain an award based on experience which they don't hold formal qualification in, contact our office for more information
